DRAFT LOCAL PLANNING POLICY AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION

DRAFT POLICY NO.3 - EXEMPTION TO THE REQUIREMENT FOR DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL FOR DEEP DRAINAGE WORKS ON RURAL ZONED LAND

Notice is hereby given that the Shire of Kent has prepared the abovementioned local planning policy pursuant to the Deemed Provisions of the *Planning and Development* (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.

The intent of the proposed policy is to provide an express exemption to the need for development approval for deep drainage works on all 'Rural' zoned land in the Shire's municipal district subject to compliance with a number of acceptable development criteria.

Details of the proposed policy are available for inspection on the Public Notices section of the Shire's website (https://www.kent.wa.gov.au/public-notices/) and at the Shire's Administration Centre at 24-26 Richmond Street, Nyabing WA 6341 during office hours.

Comments on the proposed policy are now invited and can be emailed to admin@kent.wa.gov.au or posted to the Shire's Chief Executive Officer at PO Box 15 NYABING WA 6341. The closing date for submissions is **Friday 10 October 2025**.

All submissions must include the following information:

- Your name, address and contact telephone number;
- How your interests are affected; whether as a private citizen, on behalf of a company or other organisation, or as an owner or occupier of property;
- · Address of property affected (if applicable); and
- Whether your submission is in support of, or objecting to the proposal and provide any arguments supporting your comments.

All submissions received may be made public at a Council meeting and included in a Council Agenda, which will be available on the Shire's website, unless a submission specifically requests otherwise.

DRUMBEAT





Bushfire Information 2025/2026

PROHIBITED BURNING TIMES

1 November 2025 - 31 January 2026

*Dates are inclusive and subject to seasonal change

Prohibited Burning Times are declared by the Minister of Emergency Services. During this period you must not start a fire in the open air. During a Total Fire Ban, a penalty of up to \$25,000 or 12 months' imprisonment or both may apply.

RESTRICTED BURNING TIMES

19 September 2025 - 31 October 2025 1 February 2026 - 30 April 2026

During the Restricted Burning Periods you must not start a fire without a permit. Dates for Prohibited and Restricted Burning Times may change depending on prevailing weather conditions. Any date changes will be published on the Shire of Kent Website and SMS Notifications.

TOTAL FIRE BANS

A Total Fire Ban (TFB) prohibits the lighting of any fires in the open air and other activities that may start a fire. This incudes all open air cooking of camping fires, incinerators, welding, grinding, soldering or gas cutting. The use of equipment powered by internal combustion engines in any area where there is bush, crops, pasture or stubble is also prohibited. Farmers can still harvest their crop and feed or water livestock in a paddock unless a Harvest & vehicle Movement Ban has been declared by the Shire. A TFB is declared the evening before the day it is to take effect. Check the **Emergency WA website** at **www.emergency.wa.gov.au** after 6PM to see if a ban has been declared for the following day or call the **TFB hotline on 1800 709 355**.

AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS

During Restricted or Prohibited Burning Times all harvest machinery must carry a fire extinguisher. During harvesting operations, a mobile fire fighting until with a minimum water capacity of 600 litres, a fire fighting pump and hose is to be located in the paddock being harvested.

HARVEST & VEHICLE MOVEMENT BANS

The Shire may impose a Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban (HVMB) for its district, or areas within its district, during the prohibited or restricted burning times. This prohibits harvesting operations and driving vehicles through bush, crops or stubble.

Vehicles and equipment may be driven on gazetted roads and laneways (provided it has a trafficable surface; is at least 4 meters wide; and, is cleared of all flammable materials with overhanging vegetation pruned so it does not come into contact with the vehicle).

Providing a mobile fire fighting unit carrying a minimum of 600 litres of water is present, you may carry out the following agricultural activities during a HVMB:

- Water carting for stock and domestic purposes;
- · Travel to, from and within piggeries and feed lots; and,
- All necessary carting of livestock.

Please note that it is your responsibility to check if a HVNB in p in place before undertaking any activity that may be subject to the Ban. The Shire may notify the community of a HVMB via:

Shire of Kent Bushfire Contacts 2025/2026

PERMITS TO BURN

A Permit to set Fire to the Bush (Permit to Burn) must be obtained if you intend to light a fire during the restricted burning period.

- When issued with a permit, you must comply with the conditions on that permit.
- All permits are automatically cancelled on days where the Fire Danger Rating is forecast to be Very High, Severe, Extreme to Catastrophic.
- The shire may cancel any or all issued permits if it considers that there is a danger that any fire lit may escape from the land (under s.46 if the Bush Fires Act 1954).
- If a fire has already been lit, the Shire may direct that the fire be extinguished if there is a danger of the fire escaping.
- To obtain a permit, contact the Fire Control officer for your area (see next page)





