














PINGRUP CENTENARY 2023 COMMUNITY WALL PLAQUES





Next year, we are looking forward to some minor building upgrades at the school, including renovations to the front office and new classroom furniture for students. The right furniture plays an important role in student learning—it supports posture, comfort, and collaboration. An inviting and well-organised learning environment helps students feel motivated and engaged, encouraging positive learning habits and a sense of pride in their classroom.

As part of our ongoing commitment to understanding and supporting every student's learning progress, students will complete a few assessments this term:

- ·Week 3: Ballard and Westwood Basic Maths Test a short, diagnostic test that helps teachers identify which number facts and skills each student has mastered and where additional support or extension may be needed.
- ·Week 5: PAT Maths, Reading and Spelling for Years 1-6 standardised tests that track student growth across the year.
- ·Week 7: DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) our final literacy screening for the year.

These assessments provide valuable information to guide our planning and teaching for 2026, ensuring that instruction continues to meet students right at their point of need. If you have any questions about any of these assessments, please don't hesitate to contact me.

SOCIAL MEDIA BAN

Starting December 10, the Australian government will enforce a nationwide ban on social media accounts for individuals under 16, impacting platforms like TikTok, Instagram, YouTube, and Snapchat.

This landmark legislation aims to protect young Australians from the potential harms of excessive screen time and exposure to inappropriate content. Approximately 1.5 million underage accounts are expected to be deactivated, with tech companies facing fines of up to \$50 million if they fail to comply. The ban places responsibility on platforms—not families—to detect and remove underage users. The government has launched a public awareness campaign to help families prepare, emphasising the importance of giving young people more time to develop offline before engaging with social media. While the move has sparked debate, especially among teens and tech companies like Google, it reflects a growing global conversation about digital wellbeing and youth safety. Schools are encouraged to support students through this transition by promoting healthy online habits and alternative ways to stay connected.




Junior Room Air Bee'n'Bee's

Towards the end of last term Mrs Penney was working with the Jnr room making Bee Hotels or Air Bee'n'Bees in Design Technologies on a Monday.

Bee hotels are artificial nesting sites designed to support solitary native bees, including many species found in Australia. Unlike European honeybees, most native Australian bees do not live in hives or produce honey; instead, they live alone and often nest in small holes in the ground, dead wood, or hollow stems. Bee hotels mimic these natural nesting environments to encourage these pollinators to thrive—especially in urban or degraded landscapes where natural nesting sites may be limited.

The students had to research different materials they could use and plan and design their Air Bee'n'Bee, we were really pleased with the results with some very thoughtful designs. The students have placed their Air Bee'n'Bee's around the school so we will be keeping an eye out for

SCHOOL DENTAL SERVICE, IT'S TIME TO ENROL!

Every year Dental Health Services (DHS) offers parents and carers the chance to register their kids for free dental care at the School Dental Service (SDS). The offer is open to every student from the year they turn 5 until their 17th birthday and includes check-ups, fillings, and simple extractions.

Pingrup Primary School School Dress Code

The Pingrup Primary School community actively encourages the wearing of school uniforms. The School Council has endorsed the Dress Code for all students (Kindergarten to Year 6).

The school uniform is a visible representation of the standards expected of students and plays an important role in promoting a positive image of the school.

Uniforms are desirable for a number of reasons:

- · They promote identity within the school
- They promote pride in the school
- They promote a sense of unification and belonging
- · They encourage equity amongst students
- · They ensure students are safely dressed for school activities

The school has a 'No Hat - Shade Play' policy enforced all year round. Students are required to wear the school bucket hat for all outdoor activities. This is in line with the school's Sun Smart Policy.

Our school colours are red and black.

Dress Code Requirements

Shirt: A red polo shirt with the school logo.

Bottoms: Generic black pants, shorts or skorts

Jumper: A red school jumper with the school logo.

Hats: Black bucket hat with school logo.

Socks: Pingrup Logo Socks, Short/crew plain black or white socks.

Parents and caregivers are asked to clearly name all clothing items.

Year 6 Leavers' Shirt

Students in Year 6 have the option of purchasing a Leavers' shirt. The style may vary from year to year. The shirt may be worn in place of the regular school shirt.

Footwear

- Footwear should be suitable for a student's active and busy day and must be worn at all times
- Sneakers or enclosed shoes are the preferred footwear. Sandals are permitted.
- Thongs, ugg boots, and slip-on shoes are not considered appropriate and are not allowed
- Exemptions may be made for special occasions i.e. swimming lessons.

Hair and Jewellery

- Hair should be neat and secured away from the face. Hair that is shoulder length or longer must be tied back. This is a health and safety issue.
- Hair ties, head bands and clips that are minimal in size and are the school colours are permitted.
- A watch and either sleepers or studs may be worn. Other items of jewellery may not be worn for safety reasons.

Nails

Nail polish and acrylic/false nails are not permitted to be worn.

Non-Compliance

- Students not following the Dress Code will, in the first instance, have a discussion with the Principal, on the requirement to wear the school Dress Code. If this action fails to elicit compliance, then:
- The Parents/Caregivers will be contacted by the Principal, whereby parents will be asked to ensure that the student complies with the Dress Code.
- Assistance/support will be provided for parents/caregivers to obtain suitable clothing if necessary.

Changes to the Dress Code

Changes to the Dress Code requirements will be kept to a minimum. All changes will be carried out in consultation with the P&C, School Council and staff.
