





BURSTON

1911 to 1974

A Victorian, Harry Augustus Burston, was allocated Block Location 9772 of 1,000 acres north of Pingrup on the Chinocup Plan in early August 1911. His brother-in-law to be, Frank Johnston, was allocated adjoining Block Location 9773 also of 1,000 acres. Harry married Miss Eva Agnes Johnston on the 21st of August 1911. Eva had made her own wedding dress, which is still held within the family by a great granddaughter. On the 23rd of August 1911 they sailed from Port Melbourne to Albany Western Australia, arriving on the 6th of September 1911.

They brought with them a horse and a jinker (small cart) plus some personal belongings. They travelled by train from Albany to Katanning where Eva and Frank's brother Percy Johnston met them. The next day they camped at Badgebup and then moved on to the Shields property (Durrunook) north of Nampup (Nyabing). The next day they arrived at Percy's property at Kuringup. Eva took on the cooking and domestic duties for the men. On washing day she took the horse and jinker about ten miles (16km) to a soak where she washed and hung the clothes on bushes to dry. The soak had been dug previously by a group of explorers (John Holland) who had set out from Broome Hill and blazed a track through to Coolgardie. In December 1911, Harry and Frank commenced work on their land selections by clearing the vegetation with an axe and grubber.

Larger trees were ringbarked. Both men had been timber workers in Victoria so were very experienced with an axe. In February 1912 they commenced burning up and they also dug out a dam to collect water, using only a pick, shovel and wheelbarrow. Eva remained at Kuringup until Harry had built a bush humpy to live in. In 1918, Harry took on the contract to clear and grub the last section of road from Pingrup to Lake Grace, to a width of 12 feet at £2 per chain (3.6m wide @ \$4 per 20m).

Frank Johnston then enlisted in the Australian Army (SN1078) and embarked on 10th May 1915. Troupier Johnston landed in Gallipoli at the end of August then onto Egypt in 1915. He also served in France and Belgium. In 1918 he was wounded and returned to Australia. At rank of Sergeant he was discharged on the 11th of Dec 1918. When he returned he handed over his selection of land in north Pingrup to his sister Eva and returned to Victoria.

Harry and Eva Burston had four children; Amy was born on June 23rd 1912, she was the first white child to be born and registered in the Pingrup district. Eva had gone into labor while washing and hanging out the cloths to dry, so gave birth to Amy at the soak all alone without assistance, as the men were away clearing bush at the time. Alan was born next in 1913, Nina in 1915 and George in 1919. Tragedy struck the family in August 1920 when Harry became very ill. Eva drove the horse and jinker with Harry and the four children to Katanning. A message was sent to the doctor and, being one of the few persons in Katanning with a car, he was able to meet Eva at Badgebup.

Harry passed away on the night of August 5th 1920. He was buried the next morning and Eva with her children left Katanning for the long and sad trip back to Pingrup. Upon leaving Katanning they were met by hundreds of people lining the street waiting to see Prince Edward on a Royal Tour who was visiting to thank the Australian people for the sacrifices they made during WW1. On the 3rd November 1920, only three months after Harry's death the then Premier, James Mitchell, visited Pingrup and met with a number of settlers at Eva's home as part of a pre-arranged deputation. The Premier had come to give them the good news that the railway line would soon be built from Nyabing to Pingrup. He said he thought the settler development in the district more than justified it. The deputation of settlers also requested that a school be allocated to the district of North Pingrup.

A few years later on the 27th of August 1922 Eva married another local settler, Patrick Ryan, and their daughter Frances was born 30th of November 1923. Patrick owned the land where most of Pingrup town

is situated today. The marriage only lasted a few years and ending in divorce. It was many years later that Eva changed her surname by deed poll from Ryan back to Burston. Eva carried on running her farm and she also purchased the local general store in Pingrup in 1936 from Ron Newbey. Land Titles show it was in joint name with her daughter Nina. Early each Thursday morning she would catch her favorite horse Ness, put on the harness and set off for town to open up the store. There was a small room at the back where Eva, Nina and Frances would stay Thursday night. Thursday was the day the train would arrive.

Eva's daughter Nina then married James Davidson in 1943 and moved to Scarborough to live. Eva's youngest daughter Frances Ryan, left Pingrup in 1941 to join the women's Army. She became an experienced nurse and then matron of several hospitals in WA. This left Eva to run the shop on her own. Then in 1952 Eva sold her shop to Pieter Koole and it appears that this was for his father-in-law, Bert Hudson, to take over running the shop. Eva Burston then handed over her farming property to her eldest son Alan.

Eva in 1946 had the honor of cutting the ribbon at the opening of the new Pingrup Hall in the main street. She also donated her block of land in town which became a playground and named Burston Park. There is also a Burston Street in Pingrup named after her. Unfortunately Eva suffered a stroke in 1965 and moved back to Katanning into a Church of England nursing home where she passed away on 12th of June 1969 aged 83.

Eva's son Alan and his older sister Amy worked tirelessly on the farm. In 1932, Amy married Robert Coutts (Eva's Scottish workman) and they both continued to work on the Burston farm before starting their own property alongside and reared a family there.

Alan attended school at Pingrup and then Harvey Agricultural School. Following the depression years he obtained full time work at Norseman in the gold mines. He married Constance Collingwood in 1939. In 1942 he joined the Royal Australian Air Force (88552 Leading Aircraftman). He was discharged in March 1946 and took on share farming at Bulyee before returning back to the farm at Pingrup. Alan and Constance had three children, Graham born in 1943, Raymond in 1946 and Carol in 1954. Alan was granted two conditional purchase blocks totaling 4,400 acres (1780 ha) of virgin mallee country, east of the home farm on Farr Road. He worked alone to start with camping on the block in an old corrugated iron tank and then his sons, Graham and Raymond, helped out. Ill health soon took its toll on the men. Alan suffered with server arthritis and Raymond with back problems. Alan served for many years as a shire councilor for the Kent Shire. He was known for his fearless and outspoken defence of both private and public matters that affected his fellow workers, farmers and community.

The Burston farms were sold in May 1974. Alan and Connie initially retired to Katanning and then moved to Greenwood in Perth to be nearer to their family. Graham and his wife Beth moved to Perth. Raymond and his wife Sandra moved to England.

Alan died on 17th of October 2000 aged 86. Constance died on 27th of August 2010 aged 93. Graham died on 3rd of June 2015 aged 71 and Raymond died in London on 22 September 1996 aged 50.

July In Your Garden

When you look outside this time of year the last thing you feel like doing is standing out in the cold, wet and windy weather, especially if you live in the cooler areas. Don't let this put you off. There is so much to do in the garden and a lot more to do in the garden shed. Get off the couch and put on the thermals, the beanie, a coat and your gumboots and warm yourself up with some winter garden love.

Of course, the following is just a rough guide, and many of you will find your situation varies from the above listing due to microclimates created in your garden, location in relation to your nearest major city, extremes of weather and garden type. But the one thing that remains the same for all zones and regions is this: improve your soil by adding organic matter, mulch and no matter the season, we can all garden more sustainably all year round.



Tool Time

Why not head out to the shed, and sharpen, clean, oil and maintain your garden tools. Sounds tedious, but it's really rewarding, and will save you cash in the long run. Practicing tool hygiene will prevent the spread of disease.

Mulch your beds

Top up mulch on your veggie patches, herb gardens and ornamental beds. Choose sustainable, low environmental impact mulch, one that will enrich your soil as it breaks down. If in the southern states try to avoid Sugar Cane as it would have a high carbon footprint due to transport.

Green Manure

Green manure crops are good to go now... improve that dormant veggie patch. In cooler to temperate areas you can use crops like faba beans or field peas and for warmer areas try mung beans. Remember to chop and drop them before they flower.

Pruning & Weeding

Pruning and weeding is a great job to do at this time of year. Deciduous fruit trees love a big old haircut now, except your apricot!

Temperate Areas

Occasional winter frosts (pretty much most of the inland, some areas of Victoria, most of SA and the southern area of WA)

There's not too much happening in the veggie patch, but you could try lettuce, celery, broad beans, Jerusalem artichokes (put them in a pot or they can take over), potato, garlic, radish and spinach.

Many ornamental and fruit trees are ready to plant now, so try figs, pistachios, bare-rooted roses and vines (non-invasive of course)

What is Foot and Mouth Disease?

Foot and mouth disease (FMD) is a highly contagious viral disease of livestock causing fever followed by the development of vesicles (blisters) chiefly in the mouth and on the feet.

FMD is generally not lethal to adult animals, but it can kill young animals and cause serious production losses.

It affects cloven-hoofed animals (those with divided hoofs) including:

- cattle
- buffalo
- camels
- sheep
- goats
- deer
- pigs.

FMD is not considered a risk to public health as infection from animals to humans is extremely rare. FMD should not be confused with the human disease (hand, foot and mouth disease), caused by a different virus which commonly affects young children.

It is not present in Australia but is endemic throughout the Middle East, Africa, Asia and most of South America.

The most significant risk of entry of FMD into Australia is through illegal entry of meat and dairy products infected with the FMD virus and subsequent illegal feeding of these products (swill) to pigs.

Most countries would ban our livestock and livestock products as soon as foot and mouth disease is found. It is unlikely these restrictions would be lifted until Australia could prove that the disease had been eradicated.

The economic effects of an outbreak of FMD, would be enormous to individuals, the farming industry, and subsidiary and support industries.

Australia's major livestock industries would be directly affected from export market closures and the disruption to production associated with the disease and response activities.

There would be significant flow-on economic losses and social impacts to many rural and regional businesses that rely on livestock industry revenue.

The outbreak of foot-and-mouth disease in the United Kingdom in 2001 caused a crisis in British agriculture and tourism. This epizootic saw 2,000 cases of the disease in farms across most of the British countryside. Over 6 million cows and sheep were killed in an eventually successful attempt to halt the disease. Cumbria was the worst affected area of the country, with 893 cases.

With the intention of controlling the spread of the disease, public rights of way across land were closed by order. This damaged the popularity of the Lake District as a tourist destination and led to the cancellation of that year's Cheltenham Festival, as well as the British

Rally Championship for the 2001 season and delaying that year's general election by a month. Crufts, the dog-based festival had to be postponed by 2 months from March to May 2001. By the time that the disease was halted in October 2001, the crisis was estimated to have cost the United Kingdom £8bn.

The consensus is that the probable source of the UK FMD virus outbreak came from infected or contaminated meat that was part of the swill being fed to pigs at Burnside Farm in Heddon-on-the-Wall. The swill had not been properly heat-sterilized and the virus had thus been allowed to infect the pigs.

Foot and mouth disease virus is carried by live cloven-hoofed animals and in meat and dairy products, as well as in soil, bones, untreated hides, vehicles and equipment used with these animals. It can survive in frozen, chilled and freeze-dried foods including meat and dairy products. It can also be carried on people's clothing and footwear.

The virus has not been detected in Australia for more than 100 years. But we should be aware of the risks of FMD arriving on our shores. FMD can be transmitted in air particles between animals housed closely together.

With the recent outbreak in Bali, Indonesia it is a high priority for Australia to keep the disease from breaching our shores. Although confident in Australia's strong biosecurity measures, no one should take anything for granted.





The Australian government has announced a range of new measures for travellers from Bali into Australia. These include biosecurity detector dogs at airports, additional signage and information about FMD for travellers and staff, as well as biosecurity officers present on all flights from Indonesia to Australia.

What makes FMD virus so remarkable is its environmental resistance. It can persist on many inanimate objects, such as equipment used with livestock, people's clothing and shoes, on the tyres of vehicles and in livestock transport. It has been shown to survive for more than 6 months on the soil surface under snow.

It can also persist in livestock feed and livestock products, such as meat and hides. It can even remain infectious on the hands and within noses of those in contact with infected livestock.

The nature of this virus is what scares agricultural industries. FMD virus could plausibly be introduced via a tourist's contaminated shoes, or through smuggled meat products in a passenger's bag or the mail. There is a plethora of incursion pathways.

If Australia's feral animal population gets infected, it might mean we can never eradicate FMD, should an incursion occur.





